<u>Information for Parents and Carers - 2023-2024</u>

Below you will find a list of routines we have in place.

What about	Information
Absence Reporting	As always, please report your child's absence to us before 9am in the morning via telephone,
	telling us your child's name, class and the reason for their absence. Please do this to avoid us
	having to call and chase families or cause any unnecessary worry about a child or family.
Accelerated reader quizzes	These are completed in school only. Each class has devices for this.
at Junior School	
Assemblies	Assemblies are planned for the schools and year groups. There are weekly Celebration
	Assemblies as well as Singing Assemblies as well as carefully mapped assemblies delivered by our
	Federation staff and invited visitors.
Attendance	We continue to place a high priority on attendance, and each child should have. As a minimum,
	95% attendance. We monitor this carefully and have measures in place to highlight levels of
	attendance for each child and supportive measures in place to improve it where necessary.
Bags	If your child is in Reception , Year 1 or 2 - please send a book bag every day.
	Children in Reception, Year 1 or 2 should not bring another bag with them.
	In Years 3 - 6, bags should only come in if absolutely necessary. Bags should be as small as
	possible. We cannot accommodate large rucksacks as they take up too much room. Please make
	bags as small as possible, just to hold a lunchbox, water bottle, reading book and snack.
Behaviour	As always, we will have high behaviour expectations and firm boundaries and rules, for the
	benefit of everyone and to ensure we can all have a calm and safe school experience. If any
	children behave in a manner that is unacceptable or could cause a risk to others, then this will be
	sanctioned. Please support us by reinforcing the golden rules with your child, and the need to
	ensure they behave in a safe way for everyone. Good behaviour is praised and rewarded.
Bikes	Children with a Federation Permit are able to use our school bike sheds daily. Bikes are to be
	placed in bike sheds during arrival time (8:40-55) and collected when all children have been
	handed over to collecting adults at the end of the school day.
Breaktimes	Breaktimes allow opportunities to mix. Generally, Reception and Year 1 share a playground, Year 2
	have a separate playground, Years 3 and 4 share a playground and Years 5 and 6 share a
	playground. At times, these arrangements may change.
Car Parks	As usual, the car parks are for staff use only . This will be strictly adhered to. If you are
	collecting your child for an appointment etc then please park safely on the road outside.
Class dojo	Class dojo will continue to be used for children in Years 1-6 and is free and easily accessible to
	everyone. If you do not know how to use it, please do ask and check the guide on the website. You
	can communicate non urgent messages through this to the teacher but please be mindful they will
	be teaching during the day and are not expected to check it outside of working hours. Urgent
	messages and attendance messages should be phoned through to the office please.
Clubs	We run different clubs in the year, with many at lunchtime and a small number after school for
	Junior children.
Coats	Please ensure your child has a warm, waterproof coat for school
COVID absence	Please check Government guidance for the most up to date information.

What about	Information
Drop off	Please see the document about drop off and collection. No adults are allowed on site in the
	mornings and children come through the gates and go direct to the classroom door. Staff are on
	hand outside to supervise and direct. This ensures we manage our safeguarding duties and gives a
	15 minute window for children to come in to school. It also avoids any issues on the playground
	before school starts that can impact on safety and a smooth start to the day.
	Please make sure at Juniors you know which gate your child has to use and access the grounds via
	the correct gate. This has worked well, ensured we do not have large numbers of children mixing
	before school and has developed independence in the children.
	Can we please ask you drop and leave and do not wait around the gates as this causes congestion making it difficult for others to get through safely. Please also be respectful to those waiting
	and do not 'queue jump' or push past others.
	Junior children may walk through the infant gate and across the playground to the Junior School
	in the mornings.
End of the day	Please ensure you read all of the drop off and collection information on the routines and systems
	for parents and carers' information section of the website. Please queue in the correct lines and
	leave via the correct routes to ensure a smooth flow out of the playgrounds.

First aid	We have a number of trained first aiders in school to support our children and staff.
Hand washing	Regular hand washing is vital to stop the spread of infection. Please ensure your child knows how
	to wash their hands independently. There are many videos etc on line to help with this such as https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=S9VjeIWLnEq&safe=true
	Please make sure your child washes their hands before you leave home for school and we advise that they do this again when they return home after the school day.
Hoots (Breakfast and after	We have breakfast and after school clubs running. Please note this is a paid provision led by an
school club)	external provider.
,	Infant children will be in the Nursery building – this gives them their own toilets and space.
	Junior children will be in the New Hall - this gives them their own toilets and space.
	Hoots children will be taken to the playground at the correct time by a member of staff each
	morning and a system is in place for them to go to Hoots after school.
	If you wish to discuss or book a place, then please phone them on 01362 699700
Holidays	The Government are clear that term time holidays will not be authorised and normal
	circumstances apply. Schools are duty bound to follow this guidance.
	We appreciate your honesty if you do take a term time holiday.
Late arrivals	It is vital that we all work hard to arrive on time. Children need to be in school before the gates close at 8.55am. Children who arrive late miss the start of the learning and it can be disruptive
	to the learning of others in the class.
	Obviously, if you have a GP or hospital appointment and are arriving late, please let us know in
	advance so we know what time you will arrive. When you arrive at the office a member of staff
	will come and let your child in and take their lunch choices.
Library	We have a library at each school for the children to access.
-	At Infants they will bring one book home each week to share with you and for you to read to
	them.
	At Juniors they can borrow one reading book for their 'accelerated reader' and one book for
	reading for pleasure.
	These are all checked out on the electronic library systems and once checked out children are
	responsible for those books. We frequently buy new books and the children are able to suggest books they would like to see in
	the library.
Lunches (School lunch)	There will be a hot school lunch menu and a sandwich/packed lunch menu. This is set by NORSE
	who run our catering.
	At both schools it will be a one hot meal menu OR a sandwich/packed lunch option, with jacket
	potatoes also at Junior School.
	Children in Infants all eat in the same hall, with one Year group served at a time.
	Children in Juniors have separate lunch halls. Children having a school provided meal eat in the
	main hall, and children bringing a packed lunch from home eat in the new hall. This ensures all
	children are served quickly and hot meals are served fresh.
	At Juniors Years 3 and 4 eat first sitting and Years 5 and 6 eat second sitting.
	Please ensure that your child is able to use cutlery independently if they are having a school lunch. Please practise at home with them.
	Any children with dietary requirements that have been shared with the caterers will have their
	needs met as usual. Menus will be on the website.
	If your child is at Juniors then please pay using the online system. You must pay in advance as
	usual. If you find using the system difficult, then please ring and pay on the phone using your
	debit card. The offices will be exceptionally busy so please help us to be able to focus on the
	children and ensure your account is paid in advance.

What about	Information Please ensure your child has a suitable lunch if they bring a packed lunch. Chocolate, sweets,
Lunches (home packed)	fizzy drinks, food in cans or hot food in flasks are not allowed.
	Please ensure your child can open everything unaided in their lunch box. If they cannot open
	crisps etc, then consider putting them in a tub or food bag or even opening it slightly.
Messages	Please ring in with messages or email the school office where possible. Teachers will not be able
	to look through dojo/tapestry during their teaching time so please ensure any urgent/time
	limited messages go straight to the office.
Mobile phones in Years 5	Only children in Years 5 and 6 who walk home alone can bring a mobile which must be switched
and 6	off before they enter the premises and not switched on again until they leave. These will then be
	placed in a class box during the day. Children will remove their phone at the end of the day as
	they leave the class. Any phones not turned off or put in the box will be confiscated and a paren
	has to collect them from the office.
	Please note we do not accept any responsibility for loss or damage to a child's phone in our schools. Phones are brought in at the risk of the owner.
	Please do talk to your child about focusing on the roads when walking home and not focusing on
	their phone.
Parent/Carer Support	We remain committed to supporting parents and families. If you need any support or advice,
rureni/curer Support	please ring the office and they will direct you to the most appropriate person for your call or
	signpost you to an external agency. We have staff to support with a range of concerns or
	worries, including a family support worker who can support with issues such as debt,
	homelessness, sleeping, sibling rivalry or behaviour at home.
Parent/Carer events	We run a range of events for parents/carers to be involved in.
	We appreciate not everyone can attend all events, but we hope you can join us for some of them.
	We aim to give as much notice as possible for all events.
	We have events such as a family picnic, open afternoons, activity mornings, workshops and art
Davidia -	exhibitions.
Parking	With 600 children the roads around school are very busy, but please park sensibly and safely. Please DO NOT park or drop off on the zig zags as this is dangerous and we want to keep
	everyone safe.
	Walk to school if possible or consider car sharing if you have to drive.
	Please also be considerate to the local residents and do not block their driveways.
	If you can drop off and leave promptly, this will ease the parking situation.
PE kit	All children need a PE kit and this is worn to school on designated PE days. Children are welcome
	to wear their usual school shoes on PE days and change into their trainers for PE lessons. Their
	change of footwear needs to be in small bag which can be hung on their peg.
	Details of what is needed can be found on the uniform section of the website.
	If your child is unable to do their laces please make sure they have a pair of Velcro
	shoes/trainers as we will not be able to tie laces for a class of children.
	Please either teach your child to do their laces or buy Velcro fastening footwear. Earrings should be removed as always on PE days.
Pencil cases	No pencil cases should be brought to school by any child. We provide all equipment a child may
rencii cases	need for school.
Pupil wellbeing	Our PATHS curriculum supports the well being of children and gives them a safe space to talk
rupii weiibeilig	about things that may concern them or they may have questions about. We also have support suc
	as ELSA, YMCA, play therapy, drawing and talking and life coaching which we direct to those
	children who may need it. Please note that we have to prioritise this support in line with
	availability.
Purple mash	Learning tasks may be set on purple mash in Years 1 -6 so please check. We can see who has
	completed it and no work has to be submitted
Reading books and library	All children will be able to choose a library book each week, and can exchange it once they bring
books	theirs back. This is tracked on the library system and any lost books must be paid for by
	parents/carers.
	Children in Infants are given a reading book, children in Juniors choose a book based on their
Danding reserve	ZPD with Accelerated Reader. We have reading records for each child. Please record when you read at home with your child.
Reading records	we have reading records for each child. Hease record when you read at nome with your child. Dojos are rewarded for regular reading.
School offices	Staff in the office are always pleased to help with any queries or with delivering forgotten

Snack	Children are welcome to bring in a fruit or vegetable snack in its natural form or cheese (cubed
	etc) No other snacks should be sent in, such as fruit flakes, cheese dippers etc.
	Children in Years R - 2 have a Government provided fruit or vegetable snack daily.
Swimming	We have swimming for Year 5 only. They have a block of 9 weeks of lessons and then there will
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.	be catch up lessons for Year 6 for the remainder of the academic year.
Tapestry	be catch up lessons for Year 6 for the remainder of the academic year. Reception children use tapestry for communication and recording learning moments. If your child is in Reception, please ensure you sign up to it so you do not miss important messages

What about	Information
Text messages	Please do check your phone regularly as we may send out messages via text. Our management
real messages	information system, pupil asset, sends texts to all first contacts as highlighted by you when you
	joined so make sure this is someone who can access them throughout the day.
	If you have changed phone numbers, please let us know. You can email the offices.
Toilets	Each year group has their own set of toilets to use.
Tollers	At Infants at lunch time we use one set of toilets closest to the playgrounds for all Infant
	children.
Toileting accidents	We know some of our younger children may have a toileting accident in school. Please ensure they
ronering accidents	have a spare set of clothes, named and in a named bag. At the very least some spare underwear.
	If they do not have any, we may have to call you to bring in some clean clothes.
	If a child has a soiling accident, and we are unable to provide intimate care, or it is not
	appropriate, we may have to call you.
TT Rockstars	This is set up for all children in Years 1-6 and should be used regularly to practise times tables
	recall. This has a very positive impact on their learning.
Uniform	All children are expected to attend in full school uniform every day. Please do check your
Omjorm	child's uniform is correct. PE Kit is worn to school on PE days.
	Full details of the uniform are on our website.
	You can buy it from Birds, but please see our website for low cost supermarket alternatives, such
	as plain white polo shirts or non logo uniform in school colours. Birds will do an online order click
	and collect service.
	Please ensure school shoes are plain black and suitable for a day in school. Plain black trainers
	may be worn, but they should be completely black and without logos.
	Please note our uniform is gender neutral.
	We have a stock of second hand uniform available to buy.
Ventilation	We still maintain ventilation in our classes. This is generally an open window.
vollingilon	Please ensure children do have a school jumper or cardigan. They may wish to wear a base
	layer/vest etc underneath their uniform also but this is not an alternative to a jumper or
	cardigan.
Walking home alone	If you have sent in permission for your child to walk home alone in Years 5 or 6, we will be
	sending them home at the designated time. Please ensure they are aware if you are meeting them
	off site (which may be easier) or walking home alone. Please talk to your child about keeping safe
	when walking home alone and ensuring appropriate behaviour also, especially in the park after
	school.
	If their behaviour is of concern, we will remove walking home permission and ask you to collect
	them from the playground or classroom.
Water bottles	As usual, each child can bring a bottle of water only for use during the day. A plastic bottle with
	a sports' top that can be washed very evening in hot, soapy water or a dishwasher should be used.
Wellies	All children in Reception need to bring a pair of named wellies to leave in school. Please put these
	in a carrier bag. If your child attends gardening club then we will ask for them to bring a pair of
	wellies also.
Wet weather drop off and	Please ensure your child has a waterproof coat and sensible shoes on.
collections	It may also be advisable to send them with a spare pair of dry socks as we do not have enough
	spare clothes for all the children.
	The infant playground is susceptible to flooding in heavy downpours, and unfortunately there is
	nothing we can do about this. We have had work done on our drains and soakaways but the ground
	and area cannot cope with the sudden and heavy downpours.
	Changes due to flooding will generally be notified by text to the first named contact, so if you
	are not collecting that day, please check your messages and pass them to the relevant person.
	In case of flooding, we will open the Nursery gate for Infant children and bring them in through
	the Nursery and library.
